

# Hitch Pin Removal Tool and Backup Pin, Version 1.0

The problems: I pull out a hitch pin, and it goes flying into the unknown. I don't have a backup pin.

A solution: clip in a second, identical hitch pin.



Each of my two wheels has *two* hitch pins. The loose pin on one wheel lets me pull the working pin without any drama. It is also the backup for the hitch pin on the other wheel.

Funny how this turned out – I get the benefit of a tool without having one.
