

Avoiding the Hassle of Carrying Plastic Grocery Bags, Version 1.0

Before the time of COVID, I used reusable cloth grocery bags. Their generous handles made it easy for me to slide my arm through and carry eight at a time. Plastic grocery bags are not as friendly. Most of the time I can get my arm through the handles, but the plastic digs in and then won't let go when I put the bags down.

There is a better way.



I fish a ½ inch soft braided line with loops woven into the ends through all of the handles.



Then I form a loop at each end around half of the bags.

It is then a simple matter to pick up each loop in my arms and carry all of the bags into the kitchen.

With the bags on the counter, I quick tug on the rope releases the loops.
