

An Invisible Bumper, Version 1.0.0

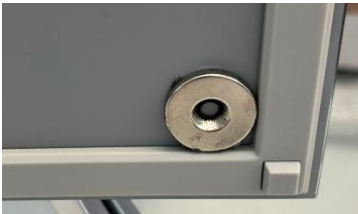

Our newly renovated bathroom has a minor problem. The corner of the medicine cabinet mirror bangs into the face of the mirror over the sink.

I needed to add a bumper, but I didn't want it to spoil the fancy look.

I think my solution will put a smile on Marv's face.



I used double-sided tape to secure a neodymium magnet to the back of the medicine cabinet door in the lower corner.

I then put another magnet behind the sink mirror that I aligned with the first magnet and oriented it to repel.

It may be hard for you to see, but there is about a 3/8" gap between the two mirrors when the door is open. If I push on the door, it will spring away from the sink mirror.

I can slam the door open, and it will hit, so the solution is not perfect, but it should meet the need.
