## PVC Cutter with Built In Can Top Opener, Version 1.0

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If you use a PVC cutter, it is a good bet that you also use PVC primer and solvent.





With rare exception, I have to leave the place I'm working and go get a slip lock pliers in order to open the cans of primer and solvent.

Not anymore!



secured it with a locking nut.

Tucked inside the handle of the PVC cutter is a short length of hacksaw blade with the teeth pointing to the right. Using an existing hole in the hacksaw blade plus a #27 holes in the handle, I ran a 6-32 screw and

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I grip the top of the can with the back end of my PVC cutter.
Then as I turn the cap counter clockwise, the teeth grab nicely.
The cap then easily unscrews.
